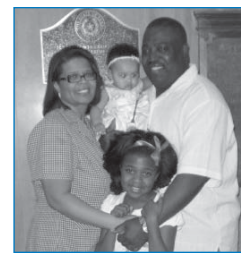
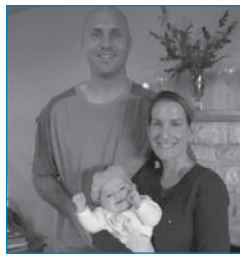

Embracing Adoption

Patrick and Patricia Perron find what they are looking for at Methodist Mission Home

The idea of adopting a child came very natural to Patrick and Patricia Perron right from the start. Patrick and his two older siblings, all of whom are originally from Canada, were adopted.

"We always knew we would go the adoption route at some point," Patricia said. "It was very natural for us to begin the adoption process."

The Perrons were surprised at first to learn how the adoption process had changed over the years. At the time of Patrick's adoption, Canada and the U.S. were only conducting closed adoptions. Today, open adoptions have become increasingly common.

Through open adoption, adoptive parents can maintain a positive connection with the birthmother. With a Cooperative Plan in place, adoptive parents and the birthmother can map out future communication between the families.

"It was challenging to switch gears to an open adoption and understand how it worked," Patricia said. "I was a real advocate for open adoption from the very beginning. Patrick – not having that exposure – needed to learn more about it before he could embrace it."

When the Perrons came to Methodist Mission Home (MMH), they learned about open adoption. Through the Adoption Information Seminar (AIS) and consultations with Adoption Counselor, Melissa Bueno, the Perrons had their questions answered.

"Once we learned about open adoption, it became a lot easier," Patricia said. "It was a very interesting evolution and a very positive one."

The Perrons began their adoption journey with MMH in late 2009. During the waiting period, Patricia says she and Patrick took the opportunity to prepare emotionally and mentally.

"We understood we were going to have to be patient," Patricia said. "It was going to happen when it happened."

In October 2010, the Perrons received a call from MMH with news about a birthmother who wanted to meet them.

"We went and met with her and really hit it off," Patricia said. "She came from a background that was like ours so we could relate with each other very much."

The birthmother soon chose Patricia and Patrick as the adoptive parents. Over the course of the next month, the relationship strengthened as the Perrons and the birth mother learned about one another and discussed the baby's future.

"We've been married for 20 years, so I think the fact that we had a very stable relationship was something that she really liked about us," Patricia said. "She liked that we had a really good sense of humor. She kept saying she felt very comfortable with us from the very beginning."

On Nov. 7, 2010, the Perrons received the phone

call they had been waiting for. Their birthmother was in labor and wanted them both at the hospital right away.

"She was really generous and very open," Patricia said. "She allowed me to be in the delivery room when the baby was born. It was really pretty amazing."

Baby Patia Michelle Perron made her grand entrance into the world at 9:11 a.m.

"All of us were speechless and breathless just watching it all unfold in front of us," Patricia said.

Two days later, the Perrons were able to take baby Patia home.

"The moment she came home was when it hit us," Patricia said. "It was like, 'Oh my gosh, she's our baby!' It was really surreal. We laid her down and must have stared at her for an hour."

Patricia says at three months, Patia is "really smiley and always investigating everything around her."

"She has this light in her eyes," Patricia said. "It's really neat to watch her take in the world."

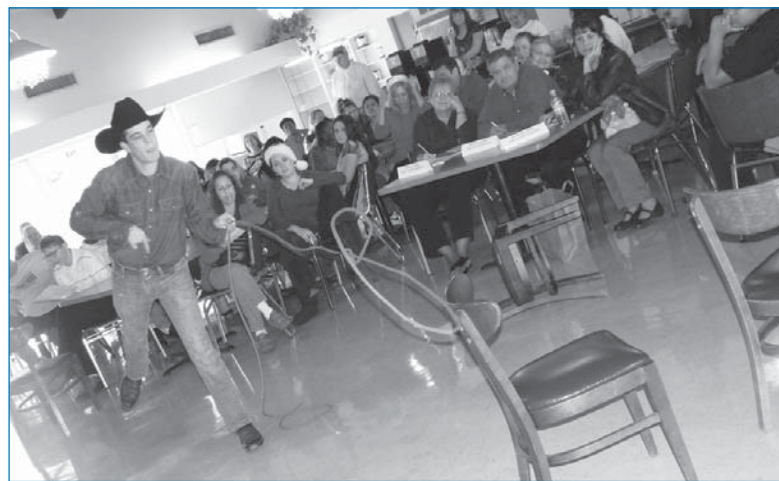
"It was a lot of fun," said SCHI student Meagan Smith. "I hope we get to do it again next year."

MMH EXPANDING SERVICES

Methodist Mission Home (MMH) is pleased to announce the expansion of services for students of the Southwest Center for Higher Independence (SCHI).

Through the renovation of a vacant campus facility MMH will create the Oasis Home, providing additional supportive services in a transitional living environment.

While the SCHI program endeavors to enable its graduates to achieve independence there remain some who, for a variety of reasons, are unable to live independently upon graduation.

Graduate residents will receive additional vocational, life skills training and counseling until they are more capable of living independently and other living opportunities become available. The MMH Oasis Home helps fulfill a critical need for the next step of transition for graduates of SCHI.

EMBRYO ADOPTION

Methodist Mission Home, in partnership with Nightlight Christian Adoptions and its Snowflakes Embryo Adoption program, offers home studies for Embryo Adoptions.

Through MMH, potential adoptive families residing in Texas prepare to enter the Snowflakes program by meeting mandatory home study state requirements and participating in supplemental embryo adoption education.

MMH only provides home studies for embryo adoption and does not conduct actual embryo adoptions or donations.

Why embryo adoption?

- Embryo Adoption is a proven, viable adoption alternative.
- Embryo Adoption is a loving option to families of the estimated 500,000 embryos frozen in clinics throughout the U.S.
- Adoptive families will receive autobiographical information, medical health history, and pictures from the family whose embryos you adopt.
- Adoptive families may experience pregnancy and give birth to an adopted child.

DECISIONS, CHOICES & OPTIONS

Decisions, Choices & Options (DCO) is an educational program designed to reveal the facts, dispel the myths and communicate the consequences of teen pregnancy to high school students. In partnership with DCO Founder and Director Joi Wasill, Methodist Mission Home (MMH) is confronting the teen pregnancy crisis in the high schools, homes and churches of Texas. Our youth need to know the fact-based information on why choosing abstinence is the best choice.

A harsh reality...many teens are not choosing abstinence!

Of the 765,000 teenagers who become pregnant in the U.S. each year, roughly 50-55 percent will choose to parent the child, 30-35 percent will choose to have an abortion, and less than one percent will choose to make an adoption plan for their child.

Why is adoption the least likely option for a pregnant teen?

Most teens have inaccurate knowledge about the consequences and life-long effects of choosing abortion, parenting or adoption. Adoption is viewed as a “bad thing” or “giving your baby away.” Pregnant teens face unprecedented pressure from peers to “keep the baby” even though they are ill prepared for the responsibilities of parenting.

How can you help Methodist Mission Home bring Decisions, Choices, & Options to teens in Texas high schools?

- Let us know if your school district teaches health education.
- Put us in contact with a high school health teacher or administrator.

PLANNED GIVING - WAYS TO SUPPORT MMH IN 2011

As part of recently enacted legislation Congress passed a law that allows those 70½ and older to make a tax free charitable gift from an IRA or Roth retirement plan. This gift, which is only possible in 2011, will be tax free and credited as part of your distribution but not reported as income.

To qualify, charitable gifts must be made directly from the account to Methodist Mission Home (MMH). Your fund administrator will have the form.

The gift must be made before Dec. 31, 2011.

Does your company have a matching gift program?

Often you can double your gift to MMH if your company has a matching gift program. Check with the Human Resources/ Personnel Department at your company for the policy and guidelines. They will have a form you include with your gift to MMH. Once we receive your gift, we fill out the form and return it to your company. It is that simple.

Charitable gifts can increase your income

Need more retirement income from low performing assets? You can use appreciated securities to fund a **Charitable Remainder Trust** that pays income to you and may include any other individual as beneficiary. You are not taxed on the capital gain and you receive a sizeable income tax charitable deduction based on the *fair market value* not the cost basis.



Charitable Gift Annuities

Charitable Gift Annuities allow you to receive a fixed annual *payment for life* and make a gift to MMH.

The payment amount is based on the ages of the recipients and whether there are one or two. An annuity for one person at age 79 is currently 7%, which is much higher than most current money market

funds. For a husband and wife ages 80 and 78 the rate is 6.1% with the surviving spouse continuing to receive payments for life.

A charitable gift annuity is a wise way to provide you with a stable income and support MMH in the future.

The Texas Methodist Foundation and The San Antonio Area Foundation are the administrators of Charitable Gift Annuities for MMH.

Want to give a gift without the hassle of changing your will or estate plan?

Consider changing the beneficiary of an insurance policy, bank account or a retirement plan to MMH.

Also you can make an addition or codicil to an

existing will. It is a single page addition to your current will.

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT

Independent Living Trainer (ILT) Angela Wilhelm doesn't mind if you refer to her as "the bus trainer." She knows bus training is one of the more popular classes she teaches students at the Southwest Center for Higher Independence (SCH) at Methodist Mission Home (MMH). Still, there are a lot of other skills Angela wants her students to attain during their time in SCH.

"Some of the other classes I teach are cooking, classes on etiquette, room organization, shopping skills, and apartment finding skills," Angela said. "Bus training (a class that teaches students how to read bus routes and take the public transit system around the city) is one of the more fun classes for them."

Originally from San Antonio, Angela earned her degree in deaf education from Oklahoma State University in 2005.

"When I started learning sign language, I thought it was easier to learn than Spanish," Angela said. "I fell in love with the language and the beauty of it."

When she and her family moved back to San Antonio, Angela started as a summer volunteer at MMH. She was then hired to help supervise the Work Training Center. Her position as an ILT came soon after.

"I was focused on working with deaf students, but when I started learning about all the other disabilities I became very interested," Angela said.

When Angela first started teaching bus training class, students were only learning how to get back and forth from work. Today, Angela has made it a point to teach students how to read more

routes so they can travel to other places like Wal-Mart to purchase the things they need.

"It's rewarding just to say that I work for a nonprofit," Angela said. "It feels great to see a student finally understand something you've been trying to teach them for a long time. It feels good to see them progress like that."

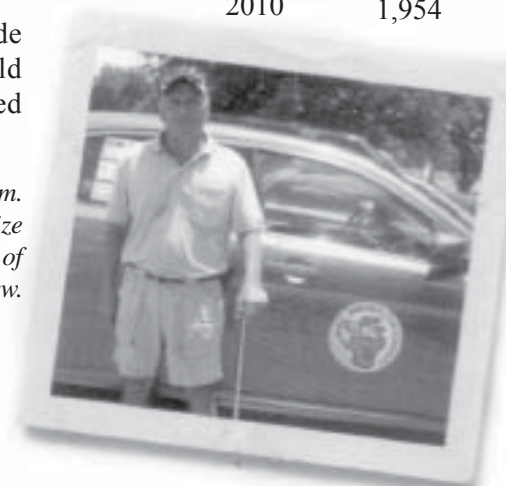
